police department >>> Accreditation

In early 2021, Chief Mark Liparela applied to the Pennsylvania Chiefs of Police Association for Police Department Accreditation.

Over the last couple years, the police department Policy Manual, Code of Conduct, and General Orders & Procedures were completely re-written and re-approved by Chief Liparela. A strong commitment was made by the Lehman Township Board of Supervisors and Chief Liparela to become an accredited police agency.

In September 2023, Officer Wade Curtis was hired part time to perform all accreditation tasks and completely manage the department's accreditation. Officer Curtis recently retired honorably from the Kingston Township Police Department after more than 30 years of service to Kingston Township. Officer

Curtis was their accreditation manager as well. By hiring Officer Curtis, it shows the public how committed the Lehman Township Board of Supervisors and Chief Liparela are to a professional, progressive, and well-trained police department.

The goal is to be finished with accreditation between December 2024 and February 2025.

road department >>>



The Road Department is waiting for delivery of our new freightliner plow truck, similar to the one pictured above. This truck has also been equipped to tow heavy equipment such as our paver and roller.

Crack sealing was one on several roads in Oak Hill, as well as 42nd Street, Briar Crest and Boyles Road. This was accomplished at a savings of about \$20,000.00 over previous years with the use of our own road crew and crack sealing machine. The crack sealing machine was purchased last year with an LSA Grant.

The Township has submitted a grant for a smaller 2.5-ton dump truck with plow to replace our aging 2013 Dodge dump truck. The dirt and gravel road grant of \$17,000.00 for the resurfacing of Ide Road with driving aggregate has been completed. Road repairs and crack sealing will remain ongoing as the weather permits.

Hello, Lehman Township! Just a few reminders from Christine Pope in the Zoning Office.

Keep in mind that no building, structure or sign shall be erected, constructed, moved, added or enlarged, nor shall any land, structure or building be put to any use without first obtaining a zoning permit. Check out the Lehman Township Zoning Ordinance for more details.

Also, it is important for property owners to know and understand their duties and responsibilities concerning the maintenance and appearance of exterior **premises** within the Township. You can check out the Lehman Township Property Maintenance Ordinance.
